**In-class Worksheet 4b: Systems of differential equations (real eigenvalues)**

**NAME:**

Consider the system of differential equations: 
$$\begin{cases} x_1' = -2x_1 + x_2 - 12, & x_1(0) = 5 \\ x_2' = 4x_1 + x_2 - 18, & x_2(0) = 20 \end{cases}$$

1. Write this in matrix form,  $\mathbf{x}' = \mathbf{Ax} + \mathbf{b}$ , and find the steady-state solution,  $\mathbf{x}_{ss}$ .

2. Make a change of variables to transform the system into a homogeneous system.

3. Solve the homogeneous system. (Recall from Worksheet 6 that the eigenvalues of  $\mathbf{A}$  are  $\lambda_1 = -3$ ,  $\lambda_2 = 2$ , with eigenvectors  $\mathbf{v}_1 = (-1, 1)$  and  $\mathbf{v}_2 = (1, 4)$ .)

5. Sketch the phases portrait of the homogeneous system, and the inhomogeneous system. Also sketch the particular solutions satisfying the given initial conditions.
